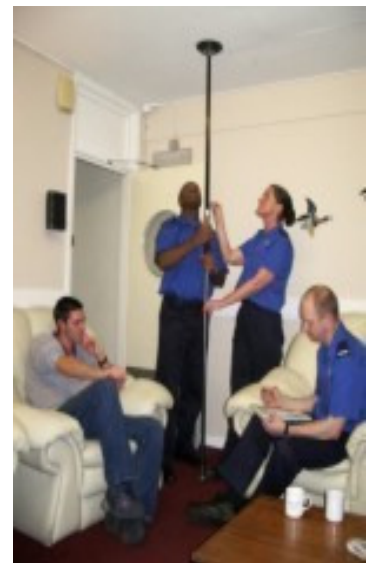

What is involved?

Key tasks of a Community Volunteer

- To target individuals within the community that are 'hard to reach' and 'hard to influence'
- Build links between Community organisations and Surrey Fire and Rescue Service, to ensure 'at risk' groups are aware of fire safety.
- Deliver leaflets regarding Fire Safety initiatives to areas or individuals most at risk.
- To assist operational crews in completing Home Fire Safety Visits and assisting in local initiatives.



Training

Training will be provided to successful applicants. Full details of the training will be provided once you have been accepted onto the scheme.

It is a requirement of the role that an Enhanced CRB disclosure is undertaken on all successful applicants

What is required?

As a Volunteer we would like you to be able to demonstrate

- A commitment of 8-10 hours per month.
- Good communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work on own initiative, as part of a team.
- Ability to complete a small amount of written work and complete forms.
- Excellent time keeping and organisational skills.
- A full, clean UK driving license and use of a vehicle would be advantageous, but not essential.
- Additional language skills would be advantageous, however, not essential.
