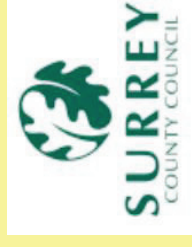








































- ☉ **White Lodge Treetops:** Treetops is a purpose built short break centre for disabled children aged 0 – 18. White Lodge offers overnight short breaks, tea visits, and day care services.
- ☉ **White Lodge Rendezvous Saturday Club:** A Saturday Club run on alternate Saturdays for young people aged 13-18 years-old with a physical disability and young people with Autism.
- ☉ **White Lodge Play & Leisure:** Holiday scheme for children with severe learning and/or physical disabilities and complex health needs aged 4-8 in Runnymede, Walton, Chertsey and Spelthorne (12 in Runnymede)
- ☉ **White Lodge Family Link:** A family based befriending and short-term care service for children and young people with disabilities aged 3 – 18 resident in North West Surrey.
- ☉ **White Lodge Twinks:** A specialist holiday playscheme that caters for boys and girls on the autistic spectrum age range 4 – 12.
- ☉ **White Lodge Rockets:** A monthly Saturday Club for young people age range 9 -15 who have behavioral issues / autistic spectrum.
- ☉ **White Lodge Domiciliary Care in the home** support for parents of children with severe learning and/or physical disabilities and complex health needs with care tasks, sitting service, taking child to access activities.
